United Way of NYC

Talk to your clients

Your clients are often your best volunteer base! Consider finding a few frequent clients who are reliable and organized, and ask them to assist on a regular basis.



Reach out to a local congregation or community group

Local organizations can help you find volunteers in your neighborhood; high schools and colleges can be especially useful. When asking for volunteers, have clear opportunities to ask about (specific dates, times, and jobs they could do).
